Now imagine that scene in the streets of Miami and picture guests eating delicious Cuban food, drinking mojitos, rum and cokes, smoking cigars and playing casino night games all evening. This vision will come to life for this year's theme of the 3rd Annual Miami Fundraiser for the National Alopecia Areata Foundation taking place on Saturday, November 17th at 7pm at the Coral Gables Museum, 285 Aragon Ave, Coral Gables, FL 33134.

The National Alopecia Areata Foundation, or NAAF, is a nonprofit organization that serves the community of 6.8 million people in the U.S. affected by alopecia areata. Alopecia areata is an autoimmune skin disease that results in hair loss and emotional pain. NAAF has been at the forefront in supporting research to find a treatment or cure for alopecia areata by conducting clinical trials, holding research summits and more. In addition to supporting research to find treatment or a cure, NAAF also supports those afflicted with the disease by establishing support groups, providing resources for parents of children with alopecia areata, and through a young mentor program. Lastly, NAAF educates the public about alopecia areata with local awareness events and through their Annual NAAF Conference.

Deirdre Nero is no stranger to the hair loss and the emotional pain of alopecia areata. She has been living with alopecia areata for 20 years, almost half of her life. In the September issue of Gables Living, Deirdre explained how she was able to heal, gain confidence and support others with alopecia areata: "I have been able to turn something negative in my life into something positive and empowering, instead of hiding and coping alone in silence." Deirdre serves as the Secretary of the Board of Directors for NAAF as well as a Legislative Liaison and Miami Support Group Leader. She also supports NAAF by doing advocacy work on Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C. Earlier this year, Deirdre met with Congresswoman Ileana Ros-Lehtinen, who cosponsored legislation that would provide coverage of medically necessary wigs as durable medical equipment under Medicare. Deirdre also has been involved with NAAF on a local level, here in South Florida, by throwing the Annual

Miami Fundraiser for NAAF every year for the past two years. For the third year, Deirdre hopes that the fundraiser will be a huge success to help raise money for NAAF so that NAAF can continue their work on a national (and global) level.
